

Election Worker Positions & Amount You Could Earn

You will need to have enough people to staff the following positions. Also included is the amount each position pays, which would be how much your group would be paid for each worker in that position.

Clerk (1) \$260

The clerk is responsible for the overall management of the polling place. He/She ensures order is maintained and the Election Board performs its duties correctly. The clerk also picks up supplies prior to the election and returns them on Election Night.

Voter Information Specialist (1) \$225

This person processes the appropriate forms to update the record of an eligible voter, and communicates with Elections Headquarters to resolve questions pertaining to a voter's eligibility to vote.

Technical Support/TSX Operator (1) \$220

This person provides technical support to the polling place and assists disabled persons with the touch-screen equipment.

EVID Operator (2) \$175

This person verifies the voter is eligible to vote in the precinct and issues a voter pass or refers the voter to the clerk.

Inspector (3-4) \$150

This person issues ballots and/or is stationed at the ballot box to instruct voters how to use the optical scan equipment.

Poll Deputy (1) \$150

This person is stationed outside the voting room on Election Day to maintain order at the polling place.

The Supervisor of Elections office will then give your group the money that would have gone to the individuals working the polling place. Your organization would have the opportunity to make \$3,600 to \$5,500 in an election cycle working at the adopted precinct. You can then use that money for your organization or donate it to another worthy cause.

We will also display the name of your group, business or organization outside the polling place and you will be added to our Community Partners Wall at the Supervisor of Elections office. Your group's name will also be highlighted on our web site and spotlighted in our new quarterly electronic newsletter.

This innovative program benefits everyone involved! The voters will also benefit by having qualified and dedicated people serving as election workers. I urge you to Adopt-A-Precinct and help out your community.

Adopt-A-Precinct Program

What Is It?

The Adopt-A-Precinct program allows your business, group or organization to help with and be a part of the election process as well as earn money for your group.

You provide the manpower and enthusiasm and we will provide you with the necessary training and pay your group the going rate for the different positions filled by your volunteers.

You will need nine to 15 volunteers to staff the polling place during an election. This includes someone to serve as a clerk, voter information specialist, TSX operator, a minimum of two EVID operators, three to four inspectors and a poll deputy.

Benefits to Your Group

We will display a sign outside the polling place with your organization's or business' name to promote the community service your group is providing.

A sign with your organization's or business' name will be placed on our Community Partners Wall at the Supervisor of Elections office.

Your organization's or business' name and contribution will be displayed on our web site, www.voteosceola.com and in our new electronic newsletter.

Your group will also be paid for their time. Your organization or business can make \$3,600 to \$5,500 in an election cycle by working two elections at one precinct.

You can also work more than one precinct and double your earning potential as long as you have enough workers to staff the additional location.

How to Get Started

All workers must be registered to vote in Osceola County.

You will need a person to coordinate and at least nine to 15 volunteers, depending on the size of the precinct you adopt.

Each polling site is required to have a minimum of one bilingual person. If your organization cannot provide this person, the elections office will assist you by staffing this person.

We will try to assign you a precinct in an area of your choice.

We will provide all training, which is mandatory. Training will be done before each election and lasts, on average, from three to eight hours.

Election workers will begin working at 6:00 AM. The length of your day varies by election, but is usually two to three hours after the polls close at 7:00 PM.

Election workers are asked to bring food and necessities with them for the entire day, as they may not leave the polling place during the day.

Election workers are asked to wear comfortable, neat casual business attire. Your workers may wear shirts with your business' or organization's logo, but they will not be allowed to wear any electioneering or political attire.
